Regional Opportunities:

Community Foundation of Jackson Hole: Grant program that provides funding to schools, public charities, and religious organizations. Grant funds must be used in Teton County, Wyoming. Click Here

Amount: Varies

Deadline: October 3 - October 28

Rocky Mountain Power Grants: As the philanthropic arm of Rocky Mountain Power, the Foundation of the same name serves the growth and vitality of communities in Utah, Wyoming, and Southeastern Idaho. The Foundation limits its grants to charitable organizations with 501(c)3 tax-exempt status, but eligibility is further restricted to programs listed below: Click Here

- Educational and research organizations both public and private, from early childhood through university level (proposals due March 15)
- Environment, civic and community enhancement and other organizations not covered in other categories (due June 15)
- Arts and culture organizations dedicated to performing arts, visual arts, historic preservation, cross-cultural education and related (due September 15)
- Health, safety, and wellness organizations including youth organizations, senior citizen centers, dependency and prevention programs and related (due December 15)

Amount: \$2,000-\$5,000 Deadline: Varies, see above

State-Wide:

Peter Kiewit Foundation: The Foundation awards two types of grants: general purpose grants and small grants. The Peter Kiewit Foundation funds programs, facilities, and capital projects. There are no limitations on the size or duration of the grants that may be requested for general purpose grants. The Foundation gives preference for funding requests in the community of Omaha Nebraska and within 100 miles of it. Two applications can be submitted by any applicant for two separate projects, in any 12-month period. Click Here

Amount: Up to 50% of total project cost for organizations with 501(c) (3) tax-exempt status

Deadline: January 15, April 15, July 15, October 15



Wyoming Community Foundation: Grants are available to non-profit organizations exempt from federal taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. On occasion, to public/governmental agencies are accepted as well. These grants are not made to individuals or for the purpose of supporting political campaigns. Click Here

Amount: \$1,000 to \$10,000

Deadline: March 15 and September 15

Walmart Community Programs: Walmart Foundation's key areas of focus, Sustainability, Opportunity, Community and Racial Equality. Shade Structure Grant: The American Academy of Dermatology's (AAD) Shade Structure Program awards funds to schools, day-cares, parks, and other non-profit organizations for installing permanent shade structures where children
